Whether the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority (GMHA), in procuring IFB 002-2020 19 for the removal and replacement of one (1) boiler unit and piping system, conducted an 20 arbitrary bid evaluation/selection process not in compliance with the general procurement 21 law (pursuant to 5 GCA § 5001 et seq.) 22 2. Whether GMHA, in procuring IFB 002-2020, (a) possessed any official or intelligible 23 criteria for the items in the Special Reminder to Prospective Bidders included in the bid documents, specifically with regard to qualification and performance data, (b) uniformly 25 evaluated the three bids submitted in response to IFB 002-2020 in accordance with that 26 criteria, (c) subsequently provided any specific or active guidance to bidders regarding 27

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- said criteria, and (d) uniformly enforced said criteria throughout communications with bidders
- 3. Whether GMHA, in procuring IFB 002-2020, lacked or failed to administer the procurement process with any such official or intelligible criteria and acted capriciously in the intended use of public funds without justifiable basis to make an award to a second lowest bidder
- 4. If there was such criteria, whether GMHA fairly and uniformly applied it to all bidders
- 5. Whether GMHA unfairly advantaged any one particular bidder in any way
- 6. Whether GMHA's determinations of responsiveness or responsibility was erroneous
- 7. Whether GMHA, in an exercise of discretion, subjectivity, or preference, produced an erroneous procurement result
- 8. Whether GMHA's conduct warrants any of the rulings requested by Appellant, including a substantiated finding that GMHA should have acted differently in the procurement of IFB 002-2020, that GMHA should immediately implement policies to avoid such misconduct in the future (specifically with regard to verified statements, signed declarations, and notarized affidavits), and that Appellant was the lowest responsive bidder to IFB 002-2020
