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

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Services Specialist Inc. ("USSI"), and preparation work began sometime late January 2020.

- 6. There were delays in starting the repair project because of a lightning strike that affected the off-island manufacturer/supplier of boiler tubes; the boiler tubes were not received until mid-February 2020.
- 7. There were additional delays after the repair project started when USSI detected scale buildup in Boiler No. 2 and requested a change order for additional cleaning. The change was approved, but there were further delays when USSI initially refused to continue work out of health and safety concerns for its employees when the island was placed in a State of Emergency.
- 8. The repair of Boiler No. 2 was completed in May 2020. The project was pursued as a hold over and temporary repair measure allowing time for the ultimate removal and replacement of Boiler No. 1. It was not until the project was successfully completed that USSI suggested that the repair of Boiler No. 2 could extend its life by approximately 5 years.
- 9. However, since the Governor of Guam declared a State of Emergency on March 14, 2020 to date, the GMHA has been focused on pandemic response.
- 10. For GMHA facilities and procurement, initial priorities included IFB 004-2020: Removal and Replacement of Skilled Nursing Facility's Chiller System because the SNF was designated to become Guam's COVID Isolation Facility, and to secure an offsite facility to safely transfer and maintain elderly residents of the SNF who had multiple co-morbidities and were at greater risk of contracting COVID-19.
- 11. While the procurement record for the SNF Chiller (IFB 004-2020) was pending review with the Office of the Attorney General ("OAG"), the existing chiller system failed on April 17, 2020. We then focused on procuring a temporary chiller to make the SNF/COVID isolation facility operational.
 - 12. When JRN Air Conditioning and Repair, Inc. filed this appeal protest in June 2020, the

GMHA did not have litigation counsel and was so overwhelmed with pandemic response that it was necessary to request extensions from the Office of Public Accountability ("OPA") to submit the procurement record.

- 13. In July 2020, the Law Offices of Minakshi V. Hemlani, PC entered its appearance for the GMHA, and management of this appeal was given to legal counsel while the GMHA continued to focus on pandemic response.
- 14. For the Operations Division, pandemic response includes maintaining our Incident Command 24/7 through both a Modified Incident Command Center and Virtual Incident Command Chatgroups to include command, control and communications with both the Guam Emergency Operations Center and the Office of the Governor; daily tracking, procurement and requests for assistance to maintain and sustain GMHA's medical supplies and equipment inventories (e.g., PPE, Patient Ventilators, Patient Monitors, Pharmaceuticals, etc.); establishment of GMHA's COVID Care Areas to include Stage 1 and 2, Care 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5 to date, which required numerous internal renovations by our Facilities Maintenance Department, as assisted and guided by Incident Command, Physicians, Nursing and Professional Support Leadership, Infection Control, Safety & Security, Environmental Services, Materials Management, Information Technology, and Planning.
- 15. On August 15, 2020, the Governor of Guam placed the island back in PCOR1 partly because the 2nd Wave of COVID-19 overwhelmed GMHA with nearly 50 COVID positive patients hospitalized at one time.
- 16. While the 2nd Wave in August 2020 was more devastating than the 1st Wave in March 2020, GMHA's Non-COVID patient census combined with its COVID patient census was no less challenging. As the only public, civilian COVID designated hospital on island, the GMHA has been responding to Guam's greatest public health emergency in its history, short of the devastating challenges presented by World War II. We have been overwhelmed and responding to our greatest

priorities; replacement of Boiler No. 1 was just not one of those top priorities.

- 17. The procurement record for the SNF Chiller (IFB 004-2020) remains pending at the OAG, but the GMHA successfully issued an RFQ for a rental chiller which was commissioned on August 31, 2020. This was a top priority for GMHA facilities to prevent mold growth in the SNF and most important to operationalize the SNF as Guam's COVID Isolation Facility.
- 18. In early September 2020, legal counsel submitted hearing materials on behalf of the GMHA and reminded us of the upcoming hearing. It was not until September 10, 2020, that the GMHA discussed with counsel its intent to reject bids and cancel IFB No. 002-2020.
- 19. The consideration and intent to reject all bids and cancel the IFB for replacement of Boiler No. 1 was motivated by the Governor of Guam informing the GMHA's Board of Trustees and Hospital Administrator that, based upon the recommendations made by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' GMH Infrastructure Assessment, it was in Guam's best interest to build a new Hospital and that GMHA's focus should be on maintaining the existing building for the next 5-7 years while a new Hospital is being designed and built.
- 20. Because we noticed that Boiler No. 2 was functionally well since its repair was completed, we realized that Boiler No. 1 could be similarly repaired, and its life extended another 5 years until the new Hospital is built.
- 21. Therefore, the GMHA intends to reject all bids and cancel the IFB, then issue an RFQ to repair Boiler No. 1. The RFQ will be issued to 3 potential contractors to obtain competitive quotes.
