COMES NOW GENERAL SERVICES AGENCY (GSA), the purchasing agency in this protest appeal, and submits the following List of Issues which require evidence or arguments to be presented at the hearing scheduled for February 8, 2020:

LIST OF ISSUES

1. Whether the Public Auditor has authority to review the Chief Procurement Officer's discretionary decision to not impose debarment or suspension on a government contractor or to

not conduct debarment or suspension proceedings.

2. Whether the Public Auditor or the Procurement Policy Office has jurisdiction to

hear and adjudicate procurement ethical complaints against non-government employee

contractors.

3. Whether the instant debarment proceedings comport with due process and the

mandatory statutory requirements set forth in the procurement law (5 GCA §5426, §5651, §5705),

the procurement regulations (2 GARR §9102, §12112, §12114), and the Administrative

Adjudication Law (5 GCA Chapt. 9).

4. Whether the procurement law and its ethical provisions apply to SH Enterprises

and the Hakubotan Building given the Governor of Guam's authority under 5 GCA §22704 to

acquire office space outside of a formal procurement if the rental cost is less than \$10,000 or the

term is less than five years.
