

GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

Guam EPA provides for the continued implementation throughout the Island of Guam, inclusive of air, land and water. GEPA also provides enforcement, permitting and public service through the various programs such as Water, Solid & Hazardous Waste and Air Pollution. Protection of Guam's waters, land and air are paramount to the Agency.

STRUCTURE AND SERVICES



WATER: implements rules and handles inspections on water pollution control and water resources management.

AIR AND LAND: enacts federal regulations on air pollution control, solid waste management, hazardous waste management, and pesticides enforcement



ENVIRONMENTAL MONITORING AND ANALYTICAL: monitors the water quality and prepares microbiological, physical, and chemical analysis.

ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES: assists various programs by purchasing supplies and materials needed, contacting government agencies, and supporting all aspects of the agency.

WATER DIVISION

Safe Drinking Water program:

ensures all of Guam's drinking water is safe for consumption

Water Pollution Control program:

protects all types of water in Guam through law, rules and regulations.

AIR AND LAND DIVISION

Pesticides program: ensures pesticides are used correctly in Guam

Hazardous Waste program:

responsible for the proper management of substances considered by law to be hazardous

Solid Waste program: focuses on management of any solid waste including residential, commercial, hard-fill materials, and green waste

Monitoring program: conducts multiple monitoring programs for the island

Analytical services program:

maintains and runs Guam EPA's certified laboratory

- Contracts being outsourced through other federal programs led to a decrease in expenditures

In the UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANK FUND.

- Prior to FY 2016, there were no contract expenditures.
- The contract expenditures in FY2016 were used for UST Operation Training

FUNDING



Operating with a limited budget from US EPA continues to be a challenge in maintaining all of our programs

STAFFING



Due to understaffing, some staff members play both an operational and administrative role

- STRENGTHEN INTERGOVERNMENTAL RELATIONSHIPS to address issues about safeguarding the human safety and health of our island
- COLLABORATE WITH OTHER AGENCIES i.e. Guam WaterWorks and Department of Public Works to take action against illegal dumpsites
- COMPLETE AGENT ORANGE INVESTIGATION
