MID PAC FAR EAST, L.L.C. ("MPFE") hereby appeal a decision issued by the General Services Agency ("GSA") and the Port Authority of Guam ("PAG"), both agencies of the Government of Guam, on November 14, 2017, denying a protest raised by MPFE regarding GSA/PAG's Invitation for Bid No. GSA/PAG-025-17 11,000 Lbs (5.5 Ton) Fork Trucks (NEW).

PART IV - FORM AND FILING:

This is a Procurement Appeal by Mid Pac Far East, LLC ("MPFE") of the protest decision issued by GSA on November 14, 2017 in response to a protest letter submitted by MPFE on October 12, 2017.

In its protest letter, MPFE claimed that the color specification required by GSA/PAG-025-17 violates Guam procurement law as it unlawfully restricts competition by limiting the number of bidders and the ability of those bidders to compete. The color specification in question required bidders to provide equipment with a "Main Body Safety

Yellow and Black trimming" color. In issuing its protest decision, GSA claimed that MPFE's protest was with merit, yet did not remove the color specification. Instead, GSA amended the color from "Main Body Safety Yellow and Black trimming" to "yellow and black trimming", thus maintaining the restrictive color requirement that MPFE protested.

MPFE maintains that the color specification required by GSA/PAG-025-17, even as amended by the November 14, 2017 procurement decision, violates Guam law by improperly narrowing specification and unduly restricting competition.

Guam's procurement law requires that "[a]ll specifications shall seek to promote overall economy for the purposes intended and encourage competition in satisfying the Territory's needs, and shall not be unduly restrictive." 5 G.C.A. § 5265. This section is in line with the underlying purpose and policy of procurement law "to foster effective broadbased competition within the free-enterprise system." 5 G.C.A. § 5001(b)(6). Further, Guam's procurement regulations specifically state that "[s]pecifications shall not include requirements, such as but not limited to restrictive dimensions, weights or materials, which unnecessarily restrict competition, and shall include only the essential physical characteristics and functions required to meet the government of Guam's minimum needs." 2 G.A.R. § 4109(a).

The Office of Public Accountability itself has recognized in prior instances that "generally, specifications shall not include requirements which unnecessarily restrict competition and shall include only the essential physical characteristics and functions required to meet the Government of Guam's minimum needs." *Morrico Equipment, L.L.C.*, Appeal No. OPA-PA-13-001, 7 (2003).

The color specification is a non-essential characteristic of the subject equipment. No functional purpose has been attributed to the yellow and black specification by GSA or PAG. Furthermore, PAG currently uses equipment, purchased in January of 2017, that does not meet the yellow and black color specification. *See* Exhibit A through Exhibit I. The equipment shown in the exhibits are both orange and yellow. Further, the trim on all of the equipment is red and white. Therefore, even if the amended specification is seen as to limit the color specification only to the trim on the equipment, the fact remains that there is a great deal of equipment at the port that does not comply with that specification. Clearly, the colors specified in the equipment are not necessary for the safe or effective use of the equipment at the port if there is currently equipment being used at the port that do not meet the color specification.

The color specification also restricts competition based on brand as opposed to the minimum needs of the government of Guam. Heavy equipment of the type specified in this solicitation typically comes in one of two colors: orange and yellow. Whether a producer makes equipment that comes in yellow or orange depends on the producer's brand. By specifying that the solicited equipment come in yellow as opposed to orange, the solicitation is restricting the brands and companies that may bid on the solicitation.

MPFE requests that the Office of Public Accountability issue a ruling, ordering the General Services Agency and the Port Authority of Guam to remove the color specification from the GSA/PAG-025-17, in its entirety.

MPFE hereby protests Invitation for Bid No. GSA/PAG-025-17 on the basis that the body color designated in the bid unfairly restricts competition on the bid.

The body color designated in Invitation for Bid No. GSA/PAG-025-17 is "Main Body Safety Yellow and Black trimming". Only certain manufacturers produce equipment that meet the other specification listed in Invitation for Bid No. GSA/PAG-025-17 and produce said equipment with a "Main Body Safety Yellow and Black trimming" color.

MPFE asked that said specification be removed through a letter dated September 26, 2017. The General Services Agency (GSA) responded on October 4, 2017, stating that it would not remove the specification. It should be noted that not reason was given for why the color specification should remain. Further, MPFE takes note that the Port Authority of Guam currently uses equipment that is painted yellow, orange, and green. Newspaper articles are attached showing various equipment that is orange in color. Further, the gantry cranes at the Port Authority of Guam are all painted green. There does not seem to be any reason to limit bidders to a "Main Body Safety Yellow and Black trimming" designation.

By limiting bidders to parties that can deliver equipment that meets the "Main Body Safety Yellow and Black trimming" color specification, the General Services Agency is limiting the number of prospective bidders. This is particularly troubling given that no reason has been stated for specifying that color and the fact that the Port Authority of Guam currently uses equipment that does not meet the "Main Body Safety Yellow and Black trimming" color specification.

Attached is a letter sent from MPFE to Claudia Acfalle, dated September 26, 2017 whereby MPFE asked GSA to remove the color specification. Also attached is a "Response to Questions", dated October 4, 2017, whereby GSA noted that it would not remove the color specification. Lastly, newspaper articles, printed from news websites are attached, showing other port equipment that does not meet the "Main Body Safety Yellow and Black trimming" color specification.



Employees at the Port Authority of Guam will have over \$5 million in new equipment to work with thanks to a couple loans and increasing operational revenue. The equipment – a total of 29 items comprised of top lifters, forklifts, tractors and other machines – were purchased through a \$2 million Bank of Guam Loan, a \$2 million U.S. Department of Agriculture Direct Loan and over \$1.5 million in port funds.

The new equipment will relieve aging port assets, assists in maintaining reserves with the refurbishment of older equipment and help port management continue operations without having to live "famine to famine," as port General Manager Joanne Brown recalled of the situation at the port in the past.

"Sometimes when we had a vessel in, we couldn't discharge cargo because we had no top lifters to assist our truckers," Brown said. "That's not the kind of operation we want, and certainly moving forward that's not the kind of operation we can count on."

The port is closing in on becoming a \$48 million operation per year in terms of revenue, Brown added.

Looking ahead

In addition to the equipment available now, the port will be receiving two more forklifts in April. In December 2015, the federal agency cited the Port's completion of a \$50 million modernization project intended to provide planning, design and construction to improve facilities and provide for greater access while also relieving port congestion.

But the Interior's inspector general said during the same month, a Guam news media article reported a breakdown of obsolete cargo-handling equipment that resulted in backlogged shipping containers and their delayed release.

The Port refuted the claim the equipment was obsolete, attributing the problem to the procurement process at Guam's General Services Agency, the Interior said.

The Interior said it appreciates the Port management and staff's cooperation and assistance during the evaluation. Since changes are underway to improve cargo-handling operations and support the needs of Port users, the Interior said it would like to give the Port time to implement them.

Joanne M.S. Brown, general manager of the Port Authority of Guam, said Friday the port is pleased with the Interior inspector general's recent notice to suspend its review of Port cargo handling facilities and equipment.

She said this shows the interior believes in the Port's capability in addressing all issues identified in the 2016 visits.

Brown said the Port is putting its maintenance plan to work, making sure there is no disruption of service and operations when some equipment need to be put offline for maintenance.

She also cited the Port's recent acquisition of container yard equipment using a \$5.5 million loan. The new purchases included 16 tractors, four top-lifters, four forklifts, two man lifts, two welding machines and a street sweeper vehicle, the Port said. Later this year, the Port will have additional forklifts, a 10ton and a 20-ton.

"Overall, we are pleased with the assessment of the inspector general. When they came here to inspect, we were already addressing the concerns they identified. They ended up suspending the evaluation, that's favorable to the Port. However, we look forward to a follow-up visit for them to see the progress we have made," Brown added.




