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THIS MATTER, came before the Hearing Officer on December 4, 2017 pursuant to the Appellant's (Hereafter Referred to as "CTI") Motion to Reconsider the Denial of its Request for a Subpoena for the law firm of BLAIR STERLING JOHNSON & MARTINEZ (Hereafter Referred to as "Law Firm"). After reviewing the aforementioned motion to reconsider, the Hearing Officer, acting *sua sponte*, hereby FINDS and ORDERS the following

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The Hearing Officer finds that the motion to reconsider has no merit. The Hearing
Officer originally found that the Appellant's request for a subpoena for the law firm was unduly
repetitious. The Appellant, in its motion to reconsider, readily admits that the Hearing Officer

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whatever in favor of the appellant. *Id.* Further, a case can become moot at any stage of litigation. Id., at \(\frac{1}{2} \)6. Further, if a mootness issue is not raised by the parties, an appellate tribunal is required to raise it sua sponte. Sinanap, et.al., v. Cyfred Ltd., et.al., 2009 Guam 13, ¶27. Here, the original exhibit filing deadline in this matter was set for November 22, 2017 and this date was chosen so that the Office of Public Accountability (OPA) could receive and process the parties exhibits in a timely manner prior to the hearing for the Appellant's Appeal that was originally scheduled for December 13, 2017. However, on December 11, 2017, the OPA partially granted, in relevant part, the Appellant's Motion for Sanctions by finding that the Purchasing Agency failed to provide the Appellant a complete copy of the procurement record in this matter and vacated the December 13, 2017 hearing and ordered the Purchasing Agency to provide a complete procurement record to the Appellant by December 20, 2017 and rescheduling the hearing to February 6, 2018. A new deadline for filing amended exhibits was scheduled for January 19, 2018. However, on January 25, 2018, the OPA granted the Purchasing Agency's Motion to Continue the formal hearing and this will necessitate a new deadline for the parties to file their exhibits. Hence, the Appellant's objections are now moot because, due to the Purchasing Agency not providing the Appellant a complete procurement record as ordered, a new exhibit filing deadline will have to be scheduled in this matter, and because a new hearing for the Appellant's Appeal will be scheduled.

2. Based on the foregoing, the Appellant's Objections to the Purchasing Agency filing untimely exhibits is hereby DENIED because it is moot. The OPA shall issue an amended Scheduling Order that includes a new exhibit filing deadline.
