Mission.

The Contractors License Board protects consumers by regulating it's construction Industry on island through Public Law 30-11 that promote the health, safety, and general welfare of the public in matters relating to construction. Contractors License Board accomplishes this by: License contractors, Enforcement of Public Law & Rules and Regulations, Educate consumers to hire license contractors, Mediate in the event there are disputes in the construction industries, Construction sites are safe, competent, and professional manner.

History.

The 14 Guam Legislature established Contractors License Board in 1977. The board consist of 7 members which comprised of two (2) members of which are appointed by the Governor from the construction industry; three (3) of which are appointed by the Governor from the general public and that have no interest in construction; and the Department of Revenue, Ex-Officio; and the Director Public Works, Ex-Offico. Those members appointed by the Governor are subject to confirmation by the Legislature. Their term shall be four (4) years and said terms to commence January 1 next following the enactment hereof.

Vision.

Contractors License Board's vision is to have professionals assist in updating our examination. Follow the latest building codes. We are also looking at different avenues to improve in all exams. Have all updated computers for both the administrative and Investigation section. Have a computer systems secured from any cyber viruses. Ability to be able to have a program that can help smooth the process of getting a contractor's license and building permit. Automate all files into one file system. Having this done will give CLB the ability to assist the customers at a touch of the button. All files will be updated in a timely manner.





Challenges.

Legislation.

Ensure that rules and regulation, statutes, policies and procedures are updated which will strengthen and support board and administrative operations.
