THROUGH THE YEARS

1983

The Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse was created.

2013

Pursuant to Public Law 32-024, Bill No. 73-32, the Department was renamed to Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center (GBHWC).

2014

Embarked on its journey towards accreditation.

2015

Developed and implemented the use of electronic behavioral health records.

2016

Provided Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) training for our service partners and the community. Developed and implemented the Quality Improvement Program.

2017

First Government of Guam agency awarded the 3-year accreditation by the Commission on Accreditation for Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF).

2018

Established Medically Assisted Treatment (MAT) and Community Home-Based (CHB) programs.

2019

Hired the first full-time Pharmacist. Opened Billing office. Became a certified National Health Service Corps (NHSC) site.

2020

Established 24-hour crisis hotline and intake services. Started telehealth services. Opened an inpatient isolation home known as the Warrior Unit.

The role of Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center (GBHWC), as the single state entity, is to provide mental health services to the population of Guam either as a direct provider of services or contract services out and have a regulatory role.




CARISSA PANGELINAN, MPA **Deputy Director**




