## Executive Summary Ethics in Government Program As Mandated by Public Law 28-76 OPA Report No. 21-05, May 2021

Our compliance audit of elected and appointed officials attending an ethics in government program training found the following who complied with P.L. 28-76:

- All elected executive and legislative branch officials, including the Governor, Lt. Governor, Attorney General, Public Auditor, 15 members of the 36<sup>th</sup> Guam Legislature, and the six elected Guam Education Board officials;
- 19 elected mayors and six vice mayors;
- Four Consolidated Commission on Utilities Commissioners; and
- 286 appointed positions serving in various capacities as agency heads, board or commission members.

We noted that certain appointed positions served on multiple boards or commissions and were duplicated in the count. For example, in addition to serving as the Director of the Department of Public Health and Social Services, that position is required to serve on the Post Mortem Commission, Prevention Education and Community Empowerment (PEACE), Serve Guam Commission, Cannabis Control Board, and Medical Cannabis Regulation Commission, so compliance counted for six of the 286 appointed positions in compliance with the ethics in government program training.

We also found limitations with Guam's ethics law. Specifically, there was (1) no one entity monitoring compliance with elected and appointed officials attending the required training, (2) restriction on who should attend the course, (3) and no penalty for non-compliance.

#### **No One Entity Monitoring Compliance**

In January 2021, we obtained a listing of board and commission members through the Governor's Coordinator for Boards & Commissions. However, our challenge remains the same as there was no one entity responsible for monitoring compliance of elected and appointed officials attending the required ethics training. Our office contacted each agency individually and requested a copy of their elected or appointed officials' certificate of attendance. We recommend an entity, such as the Guam Ethics Commission, be responsible for monitoring compliance with the required ethics training.

In the past, we found it difficult to obtain a complete and accurate listing of appointed government officials required to attend the course. Our staff utilized the Guam Election Commission's website to obtain a list of all elected officials. For appointed officials, we noted that in the 2019 Transition report, the Transition Committee pointed out that no one person or department had a list of all boards and commissions required under Guam law, a list of all current board members, their expiration terms, and other information that could enable anyone to see the current board members at a glance. Transition Subcommittee recommended the Governor's Legal Office maintain a current list of all boards and commissions and other pertinent information.

#### **Restriction on Attendance**

P.L. 28-76 requires that elected and appointed government officials attend an ethics course. All government employees are public servants and all have ethical responsibilities to gain public trust, ensure accountability, fairness and transparency. We recommend there be no restriction on who can participate in an ethics program and that all government employees, in particular mid-level managers and procurement officials, be required to attend a basic ethics-training program.

We understand the Guam Legislature passed Bill No. 94-36, introduced on March 22, 2021, which would require ethics in government training for all Government of Guam (GovGuam) employees. We believe that if an employee, and not just the agency head or oversight board, is informed and educated on their ethical responsibilities, it does not only ensure government integrity within the workplace, but also gains trust from the people we serve.

#### No Penalty for Non-Compliance

P.L. 28-76 does not address non-compliance of the law. As stated earlier, we recommend the Guam Ethics Commission be designated the responsibility of monitoring compliance of ethics training for elected and appointed officials. At a minimum, documentation from participants should include a certificate of completion (with the sponsor, program title, date of program, and number of continuing professional education (CPE) hours), name of instructor, outline of the presentation, and relevant program materials. Records should be maintained for five years.

#### **Conclusion**

As elected and appointed officials, we wield considerable power over a number of important community matters. With this power comes the expectation that GovGuam officials hold ourselves to the highest ethical standards. They are entrusted with a great responsibility to run the affairs of our government with honesty and integrity, and must ensure that decisions be made for the greater good of the community rather than self-interest. The purpose of this report is to highlight the importance and raise our elected and appointed officials' awareness of the greater scope of responsibilities their position holds. Additionally, this is also to encourage greater accountability and the judicious use of authority for the greater good of the community.

### Introduction

This report presents the results of our compliance audit on compliance with elected and appointed officials completing the required ethics in government program training. Our objective was to determine which elected and appointed officials attended the ethics in the government program training required per Public Law (P.L.) 28-76. Our scope covered all incumbent elected and appointed officials in the executive and legislative branches of government as of March 31, 2021 and the most recent ethics training they attended. The Chief Justice of the Supreme Court has jurisdiction and governance over the Judiciary in matters of ethics, therefore, the ethics in government training requirement did not apply to the Judicial Branch.

Our audit objective, scope, methodology, and prior audit coverage are detailed in Appendices 1 and 2.

#### **Background**

P.L. 28-76 established an ethics in government program for elected officials and any person who is appointed to a position as board or commission member, including autonomous agencies, director, deputy director, or by whatever title denotes the head and first assistant of a government of Guam agency, department, public corporation, authority, or any other entity of the executive branch.

All elected officials are required to attend an ethics course within 90 days of taking office while appointed officials are required to attend within six months of their appointments and shall undergo the refresher ethics in government program at least once every four years. The law took effect on January 1, 2007.

See Appendix 3 for the Ethics in Government Program as mandated by P.L. 28-76.

#### **Elected Positions**

The following elected officials are either funded by the taxpayers through appropriations from the General Fund or by ratepayers.

#### 1. Governor and Lieutenant Governor of Guam

The Governor of Guam, together with the Lieutenant Governor, shall be elected by a majority of the votes cast by the people who are qualified to vote for the members of the Legislature of Guam. The Governor and Lieutenant Governor shall be chosen jointly, by the casting of each voter of a single vote applicable to both offices.

#### 2. Fifteen (15) Members of the Guam Legislature

I Liheslaturan Guahan shall be a unicameral body consisting of fifteen (15) members who are elected at-large and as provided by law.

#### 3. Attorney General of Guam

The Office of the Attorney General of the government of Guam shall be administered by the Attorney General of Guam, who shall be elected by the people of Guam for a term of four (4) years.

#### 4. Public Auditor

The Public Auditor shall be elected by the voters of Guam in a General Election occurring at the same time as the General Election for Mayors. The Public Auditor shall serve a term of four (4) years.

#### 5. Mayors and Vice-Mayors

Mayors and Vice Mayors as indicated in § 40101, shall be elected by popular vote of the area which such Mayors are to represent. In districts where there are Vice Mayors, the Mayor and Vice Mayor shall be chosen separately. There are nineteen (19) village mayors and seven (7) village vice-mayors.

#### 6. Consolidated Commission on Utilities

The five (5) Commissioners of the Consolidated Commission on Utilities are elected at-large by the voters of Guam in a General Election.

#### 7. Guam Education Board

Six (6) voting members shall be elected at-large at each General Election.

#### **Results of Audit**

Our compliance audit found that majority of the elected and appointed officials attended the ethics in government program training in accordance with P.L. 28-76: Specifically, the following complied with attending the required training:

- All elected executive and legislative branch officials, including the Governor, Lt. Governor, Attorney General, Public Auditor, the 15 members of the 36<sup>th</sup> Guam Legislature, and the six elected Guam Education Board officials;
- 19 elected mayors and six vice mayors;
- Four Consolidated Commission on Utilities (CCU) Commissioners; and
- 286 appointed positions serving in various capacities as agency heads, board or commission members.

We noted that certain appointed positions served on multiple boards or commissions and were duplicated in the count. For example, in addition to serving as the Director of the Department of Public Health and Social Services, that position is required to serve on the Post Mortem Commission, Prevention Education and Community Empowerment (PEACE), Serve Guam Commission, Cannabis Control Board, and Medical Cannabis Regulation Commission, so compliance counted for six of the 286 appointed positions in compliance with the ethics in government program training.

In addition, we noted the following limitations of Guam's ethics law: (1) no one entity monitoring compliance with elected and appointed officials attending the required training, (2) restriction on who should attend the course, (3) and no penalty for non-compliance.

#### **Elected Officials**

Of the 56 elected officials, 54 attended the required ethics in government program training. They are as follows:

- Governor and Lieutenant Governor attended on January 4, 2019;
- Attorney General attended on January 29, 2019;
- Public Auditor attended on January 29, 2019;
- 36th Guam Legislature attended between January 29, 2019 and March 11, 2021;
- Members of the Guam Board of Education attended on March 13, 2021 and March 22, 2021;
- Village Mayors attended on December 16, 2020;
- Village Vice Mayors, except for Sinajana's Vice Mayor, attended on December 16, 2020; and
- Members of the CCU, except for one Commissioner, attended on March 2, 2019 and March 23, 2019.

See Appendix 4 for a compliance listing of elected officials attending the required ethics in government program training.

#### **Appointed Officials**

In its February 2019 Transition Report, the Transition Advisory Committee identified approximately 112 boards, commissions, and councils, with a combined total of approximately 945 statutorily required members for all boards, commissions and councils. Through our review of information provided by

the Governor's Office in January 2021 and reconciling that with the Transition Report, we identified 137 boards, commissions, and councils. See Appendix 5 for a list of Guam boards, commissions, and appointments.

We found there were 286 appointed positions serving in various capacities as agency heads, boards or commission members that attended the required ethics in government program training between January 4, 2019 and April 15, 2021. Some of the agency heads serve on multiple boards or commissions and were duplicated in the count.

See Appendix 6 for a compliance listing of appointed officials attending the required ethics in government program training.

#### **Other Related Matters**

We found certain limitations of the ethics law. They include:

- No one entity monitoring compliance with elected and appointed officials attending the required training;
- Restriction on who should attend the course; and
- No penalty for non-compliance.

#### **No One Entity Monitoring Compliance**

In January 2021, we obtained a current listing of board and commission members from the Governor's Coordinator for Boards & Commissions. However, our challenge remains the same as there was no one entity responsible for monitoring compliance with elected and appointed officials attending the required ethics training. Our office contacted each agency individually and requested for a copy of their certificate of attendance. We recommend an entity, such as the Guam Ethics Commission, be responsible for monitoring compliance with the required ethics training.

In the past, we found it difficult to obtain a complete and accurate listing of appointed government officials required to attend the course. Our staff referred to the Guam Election Commission's website to obtain a list of all elected officials. For appointed officials, we noted that in the 2019 Transition report, the Transition Committee pointed out that no one person or department had a list of all boards and commissions required under the law, a list of all current board members, their expiration terms, and other information that could enable anyone to see, the current board members at a glance. The Transition Subcommittee recommended the Governor's Legal Office maintain a current list of all boards and commissions and other pertinent information.

#### **Restrictions on Attendance**

P.L. 28-76 requires that elected and appointed government officials attend an ethics course. All government employees are public servants and all have ethical responsibilities to gain public trust, ensure accountability, fairness and transparency. We recommend that there be no restriction on who can participate in an ethics program and require all government employees, in particular mid-level managers and procurement officials, be required to attend a basic ethics-training program. The potential benefits of having employees participate in an ethics-training program include:

- □ Fostering a more satisfying and productive working environment for employees;
- □ Building and sustaining your entity's reputation;
- □ Maintaining the trust of employees;
- □ Providing ethical guidance and resources for employees prior to making difficult decisions;
- □ Aligning the work efforts of staff with the agency's broader mission and vision; and
- □ Recruiting and retaining top quality people.

We recognize the Guam Legislature passed Bill No. 94-36, introduced in March 22, 2021, which would require ethics in government training for all Government of Guam employees. We believe that if an employee, and not just the agency head or oversight board, is informed and educated on their ethical responsibilities, it does not only ensure government integrity within the workplace, but also gains trust from the people we serve.

#### **No Penalty for Non-Compliance**

P.L. 28-76 does not address non-compliance of the law. As stated earlier, we recommended the Guam Ethics Commission be designated the responsibility for monitoring compliance of ethics training for elected and appointed officials. - All 19 elected mayors and six vice mayors;
- Four CCU Commissioners; and
- 286 appointed positions serving in various capacities as agency heads, board or commission members.

P.L. 28-76 established an ethics in government program for elected officials and any person who is appointed to a position as board or commission member, including autonomous agencies, director, deputy director, or by whatever title denotes the head and first assistant of a government of Guam agency, department, public corporation, authority, or any other entity of the executive branch.

All elected officials are required to attend an ethics course within 90 days of taking office while appointed officials are required to attend within six months of their appointments and shall undergo the refresher ethics in government program at least once every four years.

Our audit also found limitations with Guam's ethics law. Specifically, there was (1) no one entity monitoring compliance with elected and appointed officials attending the required training, (2) restriction on who should attend the course, and (3) no penalty for non-compliance.

We recommend an entity, such as the Guam Ethics Commission, be responsible for monitoring compliance with the required ethics training. We also recommend there be no restriction on who can participate in an ethics program and that all government employees, in particular mid-level managers and procurement officials, be required to attend a basic ethics-training program.

As a quick-response audit, we did not include views of responsible officials in this report, however, we sent a transmittal on May 2021 and their response was not included in this report. We wish to express our appreciation to the elected and appointed officials for their cooperation with this report.

#### **Appendix 1:**

### Objective, Scope, and Methodology

The objective of our audit was to determine which elected and appointed officials attended the ethics in government program training required by P.L. 28-76.

Our scope covered all incumbent elected and appointed officials in the executive and legislative branches of government as of March 31, 2021 and the most recent ethics training they attended. The Chief Justice of the Supreme Court has jurisdiction and governance over the Judiciary in matters of ethics; therefore, the ethics in government training requirement did not apply to the judicial branch, and likewise not part of the audit scope.

#### **Scope Limitation**

Our report did not apply any audit procedures to substantiate the information provided by the elected and appointed officials or the accuracy of the list of officials provided by the Office of the Governor.

#### Methodology

To accomplish our objective, we reviewed laws, policies, and prior audits related to the ethics in government training program.

- 1. Obtained an understanding of the ethics in government training program.
- 2. Obtained and analyzed data from the Governor's Office relative to the list of appointed agency heads and board members.
- 3. Obtained and reviewed a list of elected officials from the Guam Election Commission and determined which officials were required to take the ethics in government program training.
- 4. Requested from all department and agency heads, boards and commissions for a copy of their certificate of attendance to an ethics in government program training.
- 5. Reviewed the information on the certificates and ensured it referred to the names of the officials reported from the information provided.
- 6. Accumulated all the data in an Excel spreadsheet to determine which elected and appointed officials attended the required ethics in government program training to include the following:
  - a. Executive Branch
  - b. Line Agencies
  - c. Autonomous Agencies
  - d. Mayors' Council of Guam
  - e. Office of Public Accountability
  - f. Office of the Attorney General
  - g. 36<sup>th</sup> Guam Legislature
  - h. Boards and Commissions

We noted that certain appointed positions served on multiple boards or commissions and were duplicated in the count. The count was based on the number of appointed positions who had an ethics-training certificate.

We conducted this audit in accordance with Generally Accepted Auditing Standards issued by the Comptroller General of the United States. These standards require that we plan and perform this audit to obtain sufficient, appropriate evidence to provide a reasonable basis for our findings and conclusions based on our audit objectives. We believe that the evidence obtained provides a reasonable basis for our findings and conclusions based on our audit objective.

#### **Appendix 2:**

## **Prior Audit Coverage**

OPA Report No. 06-08: Ethics in Government Program As Mandated by Public Law 28-76 (Issued in July 2006)

In April 2006, the Guam Office of the Public Auditor co-sponsored a training with the US Graduate School to comply with P.L. 28-76, which established an ethics in government program for elected officials and any person who is appointed to a position as board or commission member, including autonomous agencies, director, deputy director, or by whatever title denotes the head and first assistant of a government of Guam agency, department, public corporation, authority, or any other entity of the executive branch. The OPA was designated to develop standards for the ethics program until the Guam Ethics Commission was appointed and functioning. All elected officials were required to attend an ethics course within 90 days of taking office while appointed officials are required to attend within six months of their appointment and shall undergo the refresher ethics in government program at least once every four years. The law took effect on January 1, 2007.

## Appendix 3: Page 1 of 2 Ethics in Government Program As Mandated by P.L. 28-76

- § 15409. Applicability of Ethics in Government Program.
- (a) Any person who is an elected official of the government of Guam shall attend an ethics in government program within ninety (90) days of taking office. Additionally, elected officials shall undergo refresher ethics in government program at least once every four (4) years. The Guam Ethics Commission ("Commission") may grant permission for an elected official to attend a later program for good cause shown. The Commission shall award a certificate of completion to those completing the program.
- (b) Any person who is appointed to a position as board or commission member, including autonomous agencies, director, deputy director, or by whatever title denotes the head and first assistant of a government of Guam agency, department, public corporation, authority, or any other entity of the executive branch, shall attend an ethics in government program within the first six (6) months of his or her appointment. Additionally, appointed officials shall undergo refresher ethics in government program at least once every four (4) years. The Commission may grant permission for an appointed official to attend a later program for good cause shown. The Commission shall award a certificate of completion to those completing the program.
- § 15410. Ethics in Government Program Guidelines. The ethics in government program shall be provided by the University of Guam ("UOG") or other providers. The Public Auditor shall develop standards for the ethics program until the Guam Ethics Commission is appointed and functioning, at which time the Commission shall assume authority to develop the standards. The providers shall repeat the course as necessary to accommodate those who are required to attend. The course shall not exceed four (4) hours and shall be available in a single day and its scheduling shall accommodate the different work schedules of the persons affected by this Act.
- (a) The program topics shall include, but not be limited to:
  - (1) Guam statutes concerning ethics;
  - (2) Guam statutes concerning lobbying;
  - (3) Group participation in discussing, analyzing, and solving general ethics-related dilemmas;
  - (4) Guam procurement laws and regulations;
  - (5) Guam contracting laws and regulations;
  - (6) Parliamentary procedure;
  - (7) Fiduciary responsibility;
  - (8) Personnel policy;
  - (9) Government finance; and
  - (10) Open Government Law and Sunshine Reform Act of 1999.

## Appendix 3: Page 2 of 2 Ethics in Government Program As Mandated by P.L. 28-76

- (b) The cost of tuition, books and training materials for the ethics in government program of the officials specified in §15409(b) of this Chapter, shall be paid by the agency that employs the official.
- § 15411. Judicial Branch. The Chief Justice of the Supreme Court shall have jurisdiction and governance over all justices and judges of the judicial branch in matters of ethics as covered in this Chapter 15.
