Dear Madam Speaker and Senators,

The Office of Public Accountability (OPA) prepared a second flash report on the status of the Government of Guam (GovGuam) Coronavirus Relief Fund (CRF). As of December 31, 2020, GovGuam expended \$88.6 million (M) of the \$118M CRF from the CARES Act. Compared to the previous month, this was an increase of \$15M from November CRF expenditures of \$73.6Ma. Majority of the increases were for Miscellaneous Expenditures (\$8.5M), Salaries and Wages (\$3.8M), and Contractual Services (\$2.6M). The CRF spending deadline of the remaining \$29.4M, or 25% of the CRF, was extended to December 31, 2021.

There were 24 GovGuam entities that expended more than \$100 thousand of the CRF, which collectively added up to \$87.8M. The top three GovGuam entities were the Department of Public Health and Social Services (\$20.7M), Guam Economic Development Authority (\$19.6M), and the Office of Guam Homeland Security (\$16.2M).

The Economic Relief Programs, signed by the Governor via a series of executive orders, increased by \$3.3M, from \$33.2M in November 2020 to \$36.4M in December 2020. The Small Business Rent Assistance<sup>b</sup> represents the biggest change with an amount of \$2.8M.

### Status of Coronavirus Relief Fund (CRF) as of December 31, 2020

This is our second flash report on the status of the CRF expenditures by the Government of Guam (GovGuam) as of December 31, 2020, with respect to the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19). This report highlights GovGuam entities that spent more than \$100 thousand (K) of the CRF, increases in expenditure classifications, and amount for each economic relief programs.

As of December 31, 2020, GovGuam expended \$88.6M of CRF for COVID-19 related purchases. This is a \$15M increase from \$72.9M expenditures in November 2020. The majority of the increases were for Miscellaneous (\$8.5M), Salaries and Wages (\$3.8M), and Contractual Services (\$2.6M). GovGuam utilized 75% of the CRF and authorization was extended for the remaining 25% to be spent until December 31, 2021.

Table 1 below presents the 24 GovGuam entities that expended more than \$100K of the CRF. The top three expenditures of these GovGuam entities were spent on Miscellaneous, Salaries and Wages, and Contractual Services. See Tables 2 and 3 for details.


